1. What motivates you to run for this position.

Broad community engagement is essential for the health and success of the city.

As a child my father taught me (quoting Emerson) that the purpose of life was about more than being happy... but about being useful, to make a difference.

So from my time in the military to my time in college working in social services with disadvantaged families, my experience as Mayor balancing diverse needs and issues, to teaching in the inner city in Cleveland I have attempted to follow my father's advice. 2. What will be the biggest issue facing the city in 2020, and how do you plan to address.

The obvious issues of importance that will carry over to 2020 are the Courthouse project we are working on with the County, the construction of the new parking deck, the retail/apartment construction in the Historic District, the integration of South Town into the Historic District and further high density development on East and West Smith Road.

In both the collaborative and in-house issues we will address them through studied, thoughtful discussion and debate.

3. What will be your top priorities in office?

Budgets. Our months spent reviewing budgets in the five year budget plan ensures the stability of the current municipal operations and makes possible early adjustments to budgets as the need arises.

Rather our success has been achieved through the hard work and dedication of many individuals and organizations over many decades, responsible for the place we are so proud to call home.
