



## 2012 INVESTMENT SCHEDULE

Investments are determined by classification schedule and number of full-time or full-time equivalent employees. Two part-time employees equal one full-time employee, or total weekly employee scheduled hours, divided by 40 equals the full-time equivalent employee count.

### SCHEDULE I
